There was some discussion about the controversy with the Ector County, County Assistance district and how it would affect Midland County. Cameron Walker, Permian Basin MPO answered some of the Courts questions and discussed annexation agreement. Commissioner Prude stated his unusual outside of the box ideas. His ongoing concern for nuclear waste being stored in West Texas and the growing concern of a possible mass school shooting. The County tax assistance district is one of his secondary goals as well as the water project. Commissioner Prude stated that he felt that a public information officer would benefit the County.
