**CONSUMER DEBT CASES SUPREME COURT ORDER**

The Supreme Court issued its Sixteenth Emergency Order ending the moratoriums placed on "*consumer debt*" cases and adding new notice requirements for garnishment and receivership proceedings.

If a Defendant claims their stimulus check has been garnished or seized, **A HEARING IS REQUIRED WITHIN TWO DAYS**, upon request of the Defendant.

Courts and turnover receivers appointed under CPRC Section 31.002 **must** release or refund any stimulus payments affected by garnishment or turnover.

Judgment debtors in "*consumer debt*" cases must receive (*in any manner prescribed for service of citation or as provided in Rule 21a*) in a garnishment proceeding or a proceeding where a receiver has been appointed the following notice:

**“IF YOU RECEIVED A STIMULUS PAYMENT FROM THE IRS UNDER THE CARES ACT, THE AMOUNT YOU RECEIVED MAY BE SUBJECT TO A COURT STAY PROTECTING THOSE FUNDS DURING THE CURRENT EMERGENCY. YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO REQUEST A HEARING WITH THE COURT, AND THE COURT WILL CONSIDER YOUR REQUEST ON AN EXPEDITED BASIS.”**

*This notice shall be issued with all garnishment citations to be served on the garnishee or defendant. All appointed receivers shall deliver this notice to the judgment debtor.*
