

STATEMENT OF RESIDENCE



Who is Required to Complete A Statement of Residence?



- A voter whose voter status is 'S' (suspended). This typically means we have received some sort of correspondence indicating the voter has moved
- A voter who states they have moved during the check-in process
- A voter who has changed their name due to marriage, divorce etc. **The only time this is necessary is if the voter would like their voter certificate to match any other documentation that has changed (DL, LTC, Passport, etc)**


Statement of Residence

Statements of Residence help keep our records updated. It is important that voter's who are required to complete a statement of Residence do so **BEFORE** they are checked in to vote.

Statement of Residence should be kept separate from your combo forms and returned in the Blue Bag.

DO NOT give a Statement of Residence to every voter. VoteSafe will let you know who is required to complete an SOR.





Statement of Residence

A Statement of Residence form NO LONGER serves as a Voter Registration Application in the Vote Center.

A voter whose name does not appear in List of Registered Voters will need to vote a Provisional Ballot. The voter can come into the Elections Office to register to vote if they do not wish to vote a Provisional Ballot .
